

What's New At Heirlooms?

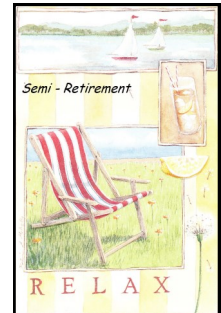
To follow is what I wrote in my December 2014 newsletter -

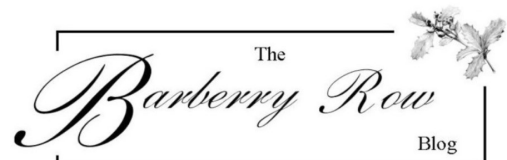

years and recommended that I carry it on - and this is what I have done. For those of you who have not heard or seen the designs by this company, all designs feature New Zealand scenes, birds and icons and the designs are only available as a kit. Each kit is individually packaged and contains fabric, threads, needle, chart and instructions. I am not changing the designs, but re-charting them and adding my little slant on the layout of the instructions. From time to time I will advise via this newsletter when I have "finished" re-vamping a design. I am also in the process of setting up an Etsy shop. An Etsy shop is a website based shop where only handcrafted products are featured. One can order on-line by placing their order in a cart. I do not have to worry about the collecting of monies - this is done by the website host - just supplying the order, and so this will be a blessing. Below are a few of the re-charted "Little Kit Company" designs to date -

Bookmarks: Each kit contains a piece of Aida Banding, DMC Stranded Cottons, Needle, Chart and Instructions. Some contain DMC #12 Perle Coton to create a tassel but some just use the 'left-over' threads to create a tassel, and some bookmarks do not have a tassel, but the ends are fringed instead. \$17.50 each

LKCBRP - Red Poppy: Since the First World War, the Red Poppy or Flanders Field Poppy has been recognised throughout the world as a symbol of Remembrance. Included with the instructions and materials for this bookmark is a write-up about the persons and how this symbolism came about, and too, an artificial poppy .

A portion of the proceeds from the sale of every kit will be donated to the NZ Returned and Services' Association. \$22.50

LKCWF - Wild Flowers: This miscellaneous kit contains white Britney fabric, DMC Stranded Cottons, needle, chart and instructions to create a picture showing some of our native wild flowers that grow on the shores of our southern NZ lakes. Price to purchase this kit is: \$19.50

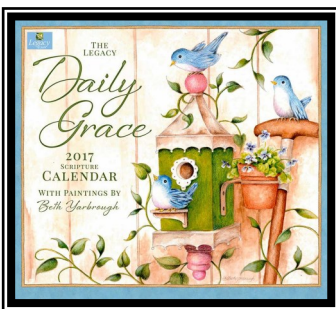

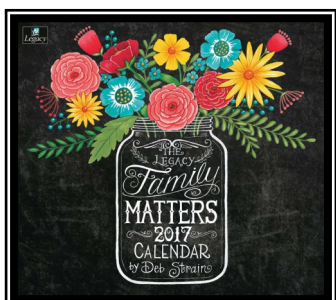

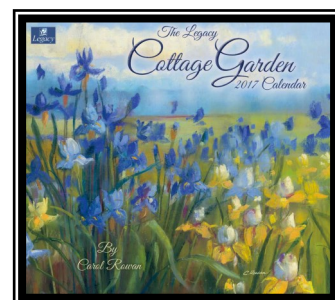
